

## Call for Submission

### Special Issue on “Everyday Practices of Social Justice”

An important principle held by members of the social justice community is for those who can foster more just, equitable conditions to do so. What does doing this type of work—doing social justice work—mean? How do we manage the tensions and messiness of this work? As practitioners, activists, allies, academics, and other participants who are building a more socially just world, sharing these everyday practices of social justice amongst our community provides an opportunity to better understand how social justice principles are put into action.

The Journal of Critical Thought and Praxis is announcing a call for a special issue on *Everyday Practices of Social Justice*. We invite submissions from all members of the social justice community and encourage you to consider questions such as:

- 1) What everyday practices of social justice have been critical to your work?
- 2) What does it mean to you to engage in critical and praxis-based work?
- 3) How do members of the social justice community—including activists, practitioners, researchers, and allies—face the challenges of this type of work?
- 4) What strategies do you use to organize communities for addressing power and inequalities?
- 5) What lessons have you learnt from participating in social justice practices or scholarship?
- 6) What important advice or lessons would you share with the social justice community as it engages in anti-oppressive activism, practice, and scholarship?

The following elements should be included within this paper, report, or reflexive essay:

(1) How is your work considered socially just or addressing issues of power and oppression?

(2) Why is the work you do important or valuable to challenging power?

(3) What inspires you to do this work?

(4) Are other people and organizations doing this type of work or scholarship?

How is your work or scholarship different/similar?
