The Iowa State University Veterinarian regrets to announce the resignation of Dr. Vaughn A. Seaton as faculty advisor for the Iowa State University Veterinarian. Dr. Seaton became faculty advisor in 1961 after Dr. Fowler's resignation.

Dr. Seaton was born in Abilene, Kansas on October 11, 1928. He received his B.S. and D.V.M. degrees from Kansas State University in 1954. In 1957 he received his M.S. degree in Veterinary Pathology from Iowa State University.

He was in private practice at Janesville, Wisconsin from June to December, 1954, when he was appointed Instructor in the Iowa Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory. On July 1, 1957, he was promoted to Assistant Professor, and on July 1, 1964, was appointed Professor and Head of the Iowa Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory.

At the present time Dr. Seaton is District 12 Representative of the I.V.M.A. Executive Board. He is also a member of Phi Kappa Phi, Phi Zeta, Alpha Zeta, and Delta Sigma Delta honoraries. He is President Elect for the National Conference of Veterinary Laboratory Diagnosticians, secretary of the building committee for the proposed new Veterinary Medicine Complex, and chairman of the Continuing Education Committee here at Iowa State.

Dr. Seaton and his wife Clara have two sons and live at 1626 Crestwood Circle.

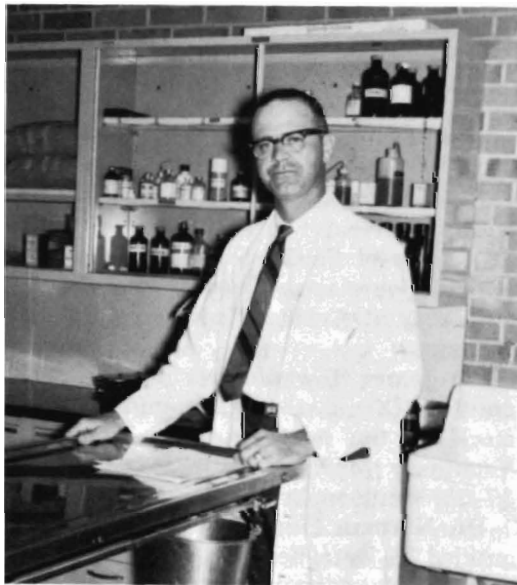
Dr. W. P. Switzer received a grant of \$2,500 from the American Cyanamid Company for studies of rhinitis and ascarids in swine.
