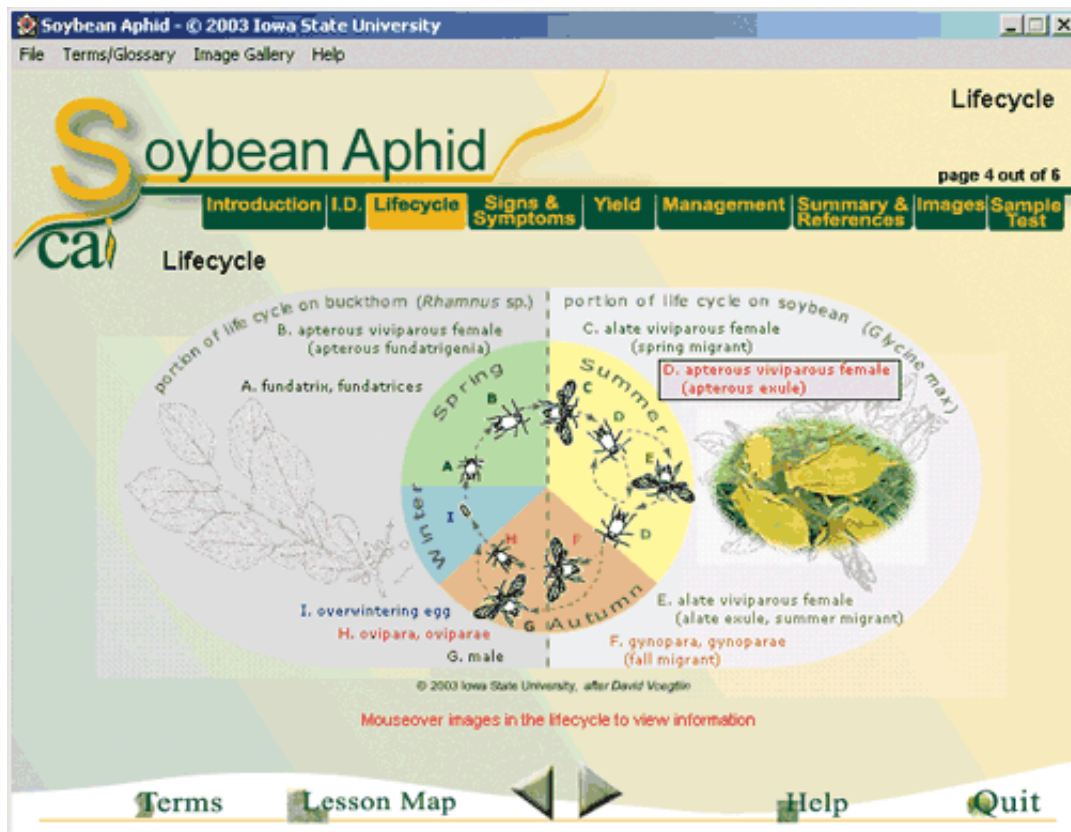

Soybean aphids were first noticed in the Midwestern soybean producing region during the

2000 growing season. Since the initial discovery, soybean aphids have spread throughout the Midwest causing widespread, severe infestations in 2003. Yield losses may be severe if the pest is not controlled in a timely fashion.



This course module was developed as a continuing education tool for Certified Crop Advisers and other agricultural professionals and producers. It contains an optional examination that may be completed for continuing education unit (CEU) credit with the American Society of Agronomy. The course is available in 2 versions, the non-credit version is \$5 and the version which allows on-line exam access for CCAs to gain 2 CEU credits in Pest Management is \$30 (plus shipping).
