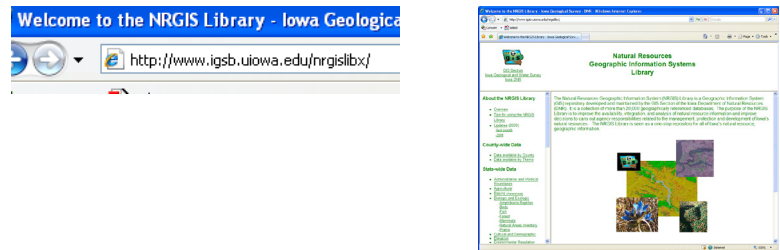

Open a web browser and visit the Iowa DNR GIS library at <http://www.igsb.uiowa.edu/nrgislibx/gishome.htm>

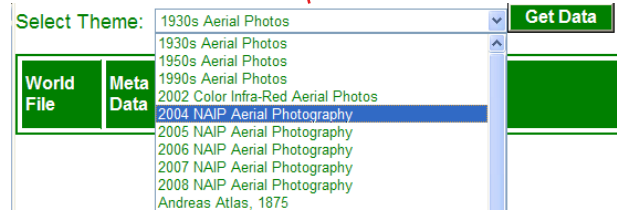
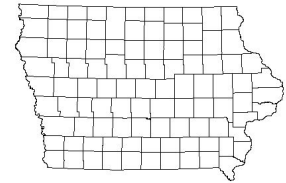
The table of contents on the left hand contains data at various levels and themes.

- To download county-wide data, select either **Data available by County** for a drop-down menu and map to find the desired county or select **Data available by Theme** to search the theme of the layer for all of the counties.

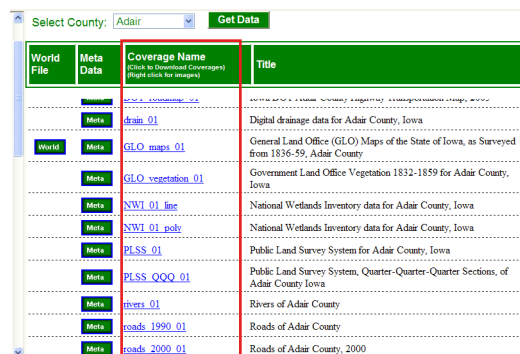
- To download state-wide data, select a theme below **State-wide Data** and the window will refresh with layers of the selected theme for the state of Iowa.

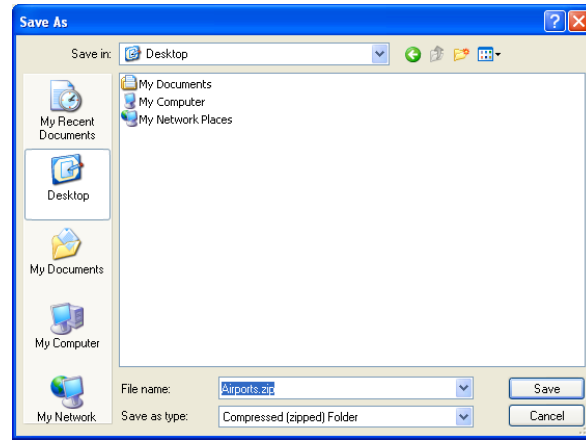
2. Downloading Data

- Click a **Coverage Name** once a theme is selected to download a layer.

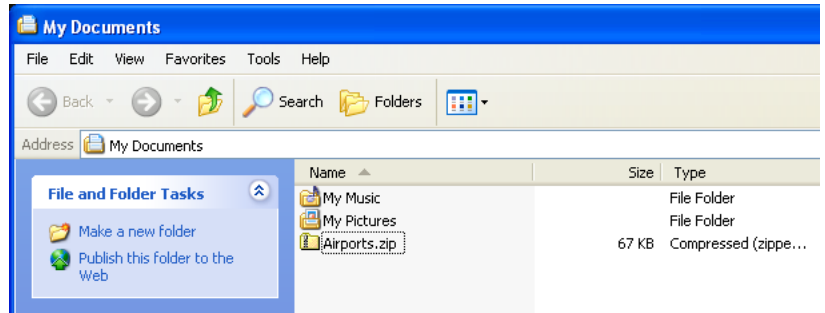
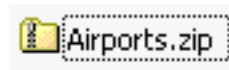
2. Save the file to a desired folder.



3. Extracting Layers

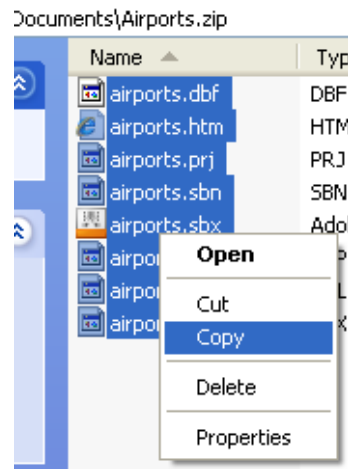
1. Shapefiles are downloaded in a compressed folder and have to be opened and copied to another directory or location before using in any GIS software.

- Locate the file in Windows Explorer.
- Double click on the file and explore its contents to follow the steps below or alternatively, right click the file and select **extract all...**



- Highlight each file.
- Right click and select **Copy**.
- Browse to a desired location, right click and select **Paste** in the new folder.

2. The data is now ready to be added to applications using shapefiles.

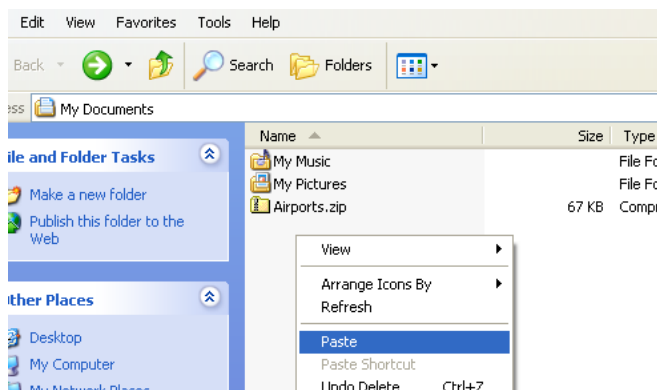
